

CITY OF MONTEVIDEO
EMERGENCY CITY COUNCIL MEETING
March 21, 2010

The city council met in an emergency meeting at 9:00 P.M. on Sunday, March 21, 2010 in the council chambers at city hall. The emergency meeting was called at 8:00 P.M. by City Manager Steven C. Jones due to the need for a formal resolution of the council to request emergency flood assistance from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and also to consider a Cooperation Agreement between the United States of America and the City of Montevideo for emergency flood assistance. Council members and area media (American-News, KDMA, KDJS, West Central Tribune) were notified via phone call from city staff.

Council members present: Sandra Hodge, Al Johnsrud, Karen Nieuwbeerta and Bryce Curtiss. Absent: Marvin Garbe. Mayor Jim Curtiss present.

Also present were City Manager Steve Jones and Acting City Clerk Jan Flaherty.

In accordance with Section 3.06 of the City Charter, an emergency resolution may be considered by the council for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health or safety.

The proposed resolution and cooperation agreement are necessary in order to give the Army Corps of Engineers the right to construct a clay dike on Highway 212, from Country Kitchen to Flinn's Salvage Yard.

BRYCE CURTISS OFFERED RESOLUTION NO. 2969, A RESOLUTION REQUESTING FLOOD EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE, AND MOVED ITS ADOPTION. MOTION FOR ADOPTION OF RESOLUTION NO. 2969 WAS SECONDED BY KAREN NIEUWBEERTA. THOSE VOTING IN FAVOR OF MOTION: KAREN NIEUWBEERTA, AL JOHNSRUD, BRYCE CURTISS AND SANDRA HODGE. THOSE VOTING AGAINST MOTION: NONE. RESOLUTION PASSED 4-0.

It was moved by Curtiss, seconded by Johnsrud and unanimously passed to approve a Cooperation Agreement between the United States of America and the City of Montevideo for emergency flood assistance, as presented.

A flood update was given by City Manager Steve Jones.
