

CITY OF MONTEVIDEO
WORKSESSION - UTILITIES/WATER TRANSMISSION LINE
January 21, 2014

The city council held its utilities/water transmission line worksession Monday, January 21, 2014 in the conference room at city hall. Council President Garbe called the meeting to order at 6:00 P.M. The worksession had been set by motion of the council on December 16, 2013.

Council members present: Marvin Garbe, Karen Nieuwbeerta, Bryce Curtiss, Todd Hay and Nathan Schmidt. Absent: None. Mayor Debra Lee Fader present.

Staff present: City Manager Steven C. Jones, Community Development Director Angela Steinbach, Utilities Superintendent Byron Hayunga and City Clerk Glennis Lauritsen.

Agenda materials provided included a Transmittal and a “Non-Invasive Pipe Condition Assessment for Trunk Watermain Pipe - Final Report” from Short Elliott Hendrickson, Inc. (SEH). Hayunga presented a map he had prepared showing the existing well hookups, transmission lines and areas tested.

Based on the results of the report by SEH, the city is now ready to request proposals for the writing of a feasibility study regarding watermain rehabilitation options that should be considered. The study would include rehabilitation alternatives, a recommended alternative and associated cost estimates for each alternative. Rehabilitation options considered by the city would include pipe bursting, swagelining or CIPP lining and open cut methods. It was estimated that the feasibility study would cost approximately \$20,000. The city will consider requesting proposals from SEH and Rodeberg & Berryman at a meeting in February.
